

A Zoom Discussion of Two Ways to Increase Gun Safety: Require Traceable Serial Numbers on “Ghost Guns” and Strengthen Child Access Prevention Laws

The Maryland General Assembly in its current session is considering two bills that if enacted could save more lives from gun violence:

- “Ghost Guns”- Requiring Traceable Serial Numbers (Senate Bill 387 and House Bill 425)
- Child Access Prevention- Strengthening Penalties for Unsafe Gun Storage Impacting Children 18 and Under (“Jaelynn’s Law”) (Senate Bill 676 and House Bill 659)

The Democratic-controlled Virginia Senate on Feb. 15, 2022, passed Senate Bill 310 to prohibit untraceable ghost guns in the Commonwealth. The bill now goes to the GOP-controlled House of Delegates for its consideration.

An expert panel of state officials and GVP advocates on Thursday, March 10, 2022, at 7 pm, will discuss the contents and status of these important gun safety bills and how you can support them in the waning days of the 2022 MD and VA General Assemblies.
